For our first column of the year, I'd like to introduce you all to the newest member of our Star Trek (and IDW's) editorial team – editorial assistant Anni Perheentupa! Anni is a longtime Star Trek fan with an almost encyclopedic knowledge of Trek continuity and a great eye for details who comes to us all the way from Finland. She's been hugely helpful in making these books the best they can be, and we're excited to have her on the crew. Since her desk is pretty close to mine, it was mad easy to catch up with her and ask her a few questions! Enjoy.

1. When did you first become a Star Trek fan?

I was maybe ten or eleven when I started watching TOS because its reruns aired on TV right before an anime I was a fan of. At first I didn't pay that much attention to it, because it was in English (a foreign language to me at the time) and there was so much talking, but I caught glimpses here and there that I thought were fascinating. Soon enough, I was



watching it for real. I was hooked from then on. A year or two later, I had hooked the rest of my family as well, and we awned all the movies and several DVD box sets.

2. What has been your favorite part about joining the Star Trek team at IDW? Anything that's been particularly surprising to you so far?

Working on Waypoint is easily my favorite part. It's so great to see all the fascinating things creators come up with when you give them the freedom to explore some of the less focal characters and aspects of the Star Trek universe. I also love seeing the covers as they come in. We have some really great artists working on this stuff.

I don't think there have been any huge surprises, although I've been very glad to find out how much everyone here enjoys working on the Star Trek comics!

3. Who would you say is your favorite Star Trek character and why?

Talk about difficult questions... If I have to narrow it down to just two, I think I have to pick Captain Janeway and Commander Data. I always liked Janeway for the way in which she manages to be both a captain and a scientist, with endless curiosity but a firm sense of priorities. She is easily my favorite captain across all of Star Trek, so I have to give her a spot in my favorites. As for Data... Well, there is just something very endearing about his endless quest to learn what he is and what he wants to be. How can you say no to an android with a pet cat? I honestly can't pick who I like better, Janeway or Data.

4. Finally, if you could join one of the Star Trek crews, which one would it be? The original series, The Next Generation, Deep Space Nine, Voyager, Enterprise, the Kelvin timeline from the movies, or Discovery?

Voyager is honestly probably the worst option out of these, but I have to pick it anyway. The Voyager crew is the closest my heart, and there's just something oddly exciting about being stranded so far away from home and having to fight your way back across thousands and thousands of light years. I would absolutely be a science officer – exobiology, or maybe astrometrics – so think of all the discoveries I could make in the Delta Quadrant!

As we move forward into the year, I'd like to expand the scope of this column to include more about what we do here, from art progress images and behind-the-scenes details to interesting anecdotes from the frontlines of working at a comic company.
